

Subject.1:Expression of gratitude for having conferred autonomous status to Surana College

The Academic Council expresses its deep gratitude to University Grants Commission, Government of Karnataka and Bangalore University for having conferred autonomous status for a period of 10 years as applicable from the academic year 2021-22

Subject.2: Approval of Regulations governing UG & PG Courses offered in the Surana College (Autonomous)

The Boards of Studies which are the creation of Regulation 13.5 of UGC Regulations 2018 r/w Rule 5.5 of the Bangalore University Autonomous Colleges Statute 2005 have prepared the Regulations governing the Syllabus, Structure of the Course, Design and Contents, Scheme of Examination, Methodologies for Innovative Teaching and Evaluation Techniques including the list of Boards of Examiners in respect of the following courses:

All the draft regulations have been vetted and subjected to an extensive scrutiny by the team of members of the Academic Council. Only a few corrections/modifications were suggested. After an in-depth discussion, all the regulations have been approved as applicable from the academic year 2021-22 itself, by incorporating the modifications suggested.

Subject.3: Admission of students to different courses offered in the college

The existing criteria prescribed by UGC and affiliating University for admission to various UG & PG Courses as applicable from the academic year 2022-23 may continue and the policy of the Government providing reservation for SC, ST and also OBCs may be continued. The fee structure shall be as prescribed by the BOG

Subject.4: Continuance of the existing sports and extracurricular activities

Even after acquiring the autonomous status, the sports activities in vogue under the supervision of Director of Physical Education may be continued and students should be encouraged to participate in intercollegiate, inter-university,



state and national tournaments to enhance the credentials of the college. Adequate financial provision may be provided in the budget for the academic year 2022-23.

The extra-curricular activities, co-curricular activities and beyond curricular activities including extension, social service and other outdoor activities may be continued and expanded gradually from time to time.

Subject.5: Adaptation of Regulations governing Syllabus, Scheme of Examination, Structure of the Course etc., of Bangalore University for the academic year 2021-2022.

Orders conferring autonomous status of the UGC, State Government and Bangalore University have been received after the commencement of the academic session 2021-22 and the classes were held in conformity with the Regulations of the Bangalore University without there being any scope for enforcement of revised regulations framed by the BOS of the College. After a brief discussion, it is resolved to adopt the Bangalore University Syllabus to conduct the academic sessions for the respective year of study of both UG & PG courses and the Boards of Examinations as approved by the Bangalore University may continue only for the academic session 2021-22. The examiners will be chosen out of the approved list of examiners of Bangalore University.

Subject.6: Enforcement of curriculum and evaluations system

Under the aegis of NEP-2020 as approved for UG & PG Porgrams by Bangalore University including the syllabus only for first two semesters keeping the broad width and depth of the syllabus, the teaching and learning methodology shall continue focusing more on skills and ability based pedagogy and andragogy components enshrined therein. As regards the evaluation scheme, the frame



work as prescribed by the Bangalore University laying emphasis for providing much scope for innovative and latest technique of evaluation components.

Subject.7: Development and designing of Post Graduate Diploma courses

In the latest scenario, Blockchain Technology, Artificial Intelligence, Machine Learning and other allied new elements are coming up to get the experts from such fields from the industry to deliver lectures and enrich the knowledge of the students. The AICTE and UGC are stressing to prepare the students in such a manner to become industry ready and for better employability in multi diversified areas of specialization.

Under clause.10.1 of UGC Regulations 2018, the Autonomous Colleges may start Diploma (UG & PG) or Certificate Courses with the approval of the statutory authorities of the College. Such Diploma and Certificates may be issued under the seal of the college after informing the University.

Subject.8: Adoption of Best Practices and Technology in Teaching infusing the NEP 2020.

The Psychology Department has off late developed a tool which is analogous to NEP-2020 to upgrade and update the teachers not only in intensive teaching but coupled with research orientation and consultancy. In this process while exercising such a weapon to bring out a better teacher engagement by ensuring that they are able to create modules and capsules based on their abilities and knowledge in teaching and research. Wide range of choices in both multi-disciplinary and inter-disciplinary courses may be inducted for the students, who have already been provided with 9 such possible electives for the time being. UGC has also introduced interdisciplinary learning simultaneously giving option to the students to choose any stream from Humanities to Pure Sciences and also



emerging courses in thrust areas like Computer Science, Electronics, Biotechnology and Management. The existing CBCS system may be further strengthened and developed in pursuit of achieving real sense and ultimate object of autonomy

Subject.9: Creation of route map for enhancement, ambience and upgradation of the course of study on a staggered basis.

Consequent on the college having been conferred with autonomous status, the College shall review the existing course for restructure, redesign and prescription of own course of study and syllabi to maintain academic excellence. Methods of assessment of students should be evolved in the latest innovative manner

Subject.10: The highlights of the suggestions emanated from the members are briefly spelt out as here under

- Reinvention in methodologies from the earlier structure to carve out the niche
 as an autonomous which conforms to NEP 2020, as it is imperative to show
 case the radical changes in the pattern of autonomy in pursuit of achievement
 of progress.
- 2) Acceleration correlated to some industry specific courses like building sustainability focused curriculum / Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) driven curriculum. Setting up of Incubation Cell and procurement of support from alumni for entrepreneurship via their past experience formulating ideas
- 3) Collaboration with National Skill Development Corporation which has constituted several sectors like Skill Councils for Finance, Marketing, Biotech and IT professionals from industry are framing curriculum to make the



- students industry ready. Skill based courses may be introduced having a tie up with them
- 4) Development of route map UG/PG Courses spread over to duration of each course

Year 1 [1st Semester & 2nd Semester]

Academics:

- Implement the BoS resolutions in a phased manner
- Develop curriculum that compliments the university curricula
- Derive maximum mileage out of the recently formed dedicated research and consultancy cell. Exclusively, College has appointed to strengthen the research activities and bring that temperament across the institutions.
- Undertake major consultancy projects with the industry

Year-2 [3rd Semester & 4th Semester]

Academics:

- Launch a few courses in association with the industry
- Upgrade the syllabus to match industry requirements and offer contemporary skill up-gradation programs for students and teachers
- Develop credit systems for social impact projects
- Set up a center for human capital development and organize MDPs, FDPs, and SDPs
- Establishment of specialized cells: Consultancy cell, Community development center, Entrepreneurial development cell
- Successful completion of NAAC re-accreditation; aim for a higher CGPA

Year-3 [5th Semester & 6th Semester]

Academics

- Launch a twinning program for Commerce/Management with foreign universities
- Faculty and student exchange program with foreign universities
- Set up BIRAC cell and secure biotech research projects



- Take advantage of UGC's policy on online education and collaborate with the industry for offering programs
- 5) Best practice under autonomy
 - Buddy system, Orbit Groups, Alumni mentoring &, etc
 - Diversified teaching-learning practices like flipped classrooms, experiential/participative learning from outbound activities, case studies, Role Plays &, etc.
 - Effective mentoring for a better student experience & continuous assessment
 - Pre Reads, Reviews writing, spot Group Discussion in-class hours &, etc.
 - Comprehensive LMS by in-house faculty for core subjects
 - Skill-oriented and capacity-building courses through 'UPGRADE '- Surana Skill Development Academy.
 - Introduction of Surana Internship Program (SIP) across all programs
- 6) Best practice under autonomy
 - (1) Focused student engagement activities through various forums & clubs for overall development
 - (2) Promoting research temperament among advanced learners and a strong student support system for others to cater to their needs
 - (3) Popular Talks By in-house faculty for academic enrichment
 - (4) Potentially useful extension activities promoting and sustaining ethical & moral values
 - (5) Introduction of ROBUST ERP for student information and knowledge management system
 - (6) Strong alumni connect and volunteer participation. All Saturdays are reserved to alumni to interact with the students.
